ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION

The Functional Vocational Training and Research Society (FVTRS), situated in Bangalore, is a non-profit organization that has been promoting vocational skill training across India since 1993. It serves as a skill promotion agency dedicated to the unorganized sector, with a primary focus on early school leavers and illiterate youth.

FVTRS aims to make them employable by imparting vocational training and building their skills.

GROWTH CARD

- ★ Trained 165263 youth in various Vocational Skills and created livelihood opportunities in 18 states of the country.

- ★ 83% of the trained youth are employed & self employed
- ★ Employed youth are earning Rs. 15,000-25,000/- PM
- ★ Out of Total trained youth 59% are women and 41% are men
- ★ Among the trained youth 47% are SC/ST and 45% are other backward caste.
- ★ Vocational Skill training is being carried out in 319 training centres
- ★ 28 Master trainers are certified by Sector Skill Council MEPSC, Delhi

STUDIES, RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

FVTRS prioritizes Research and Development (R&D) to drive innovation in skill development. Recent studies focused on tribal employability in Odisha and Chhattisgarh, impact study of skilling for tribal youth in Odisha and women's skill training. Ongoing action research, "**SCOPE**,"

targets community owned skill development in five locations nationwide. **A national-level project** with Central University of Karnataka identifies employment skill gaps. FVTRS is committed to conducts a minimum of two skill development-related studies annually, towards upscaling our intervention in skill development process.



BREAKING GENDER STEREO TYPE

FVTRS places a special emphasis on empowering young women, not only by providing them with alternative livelihood opportunities but also by dismantling traditional stereotypes trades and employment, ultimately integrating them into the broader fabric of mainstream society.

APPROACHES & STRATEGIES

People Led Skill Development: FVTRS prioritizes people-led skill development, ensuring local participation in planning, implementation, and employment.

This participatory approach leads to selection of suitable trades, candidates, effective implementation, and sustainable livelihood engagement.

FVTRS utilizes a linkage model, facilitating youth training across various sectors such as automotive, construction, hospitality, and retail. Strategic collaborations with industry giants like Hotel Taj, L&T, Mahindra and Mahindra, Schneider India Foundation, D-Mart, Tacobell, and Cognizant Foundation have played a pivotal role in job creation for number of trainees.



OTHER FOCUSED INTERVENTIONS

Knowledge Building: The capacity building department of FVTRS offers training services on EDP, Life Skills, PNAP, PRA, RBM and Community Based Skill Development.



EDP & LIFE SKILL CLUB

Entrepreneurship Development and Life Skill Training is essential to promote viable livelihood initiatives among the youth. FVTRS resource team is promoting Master trainers to inculcate business ideas among the youth and to motivate them with entrepreneurship skills. FVTRS has 399 master trainers spread across the country.

These master trainers have the expertise to provide training on life skills and Entrepreneurship Module of FVTRS is used to conduct the training and the module is customized according to the requirement of the participants.
